Kimball Art Center (KAC) exists to provide arts education and access to everyone. Through our exhibitions, educational arts programs and events, KAC provides a platform and a place for artists and arts enthusiasts to come together to explore, celebrate and cherish the creative spark that lives within us all. We believe that art brings joy, direction, a welcome distraction and hope to the 85,000+ community members we serve each year. We know that art changes lives and brings people together, sustaining our vibrant community and inspiring positive change in the world around us.

KAC has been a pillar of our art community since 1976 when Bill Kimball humbly started the center in an old garage. As the Park City community has evolved through the years, KAC has mirrored its change, evolving into a world-class community art center and the city's cultural hub. Admission to our museum to see renowned exhibitions has remained free since day one. Exhibitions provide local access to nationally renowned artists and works and include quarterly Art Talks and Gallery Tours. We also provide over 300 visual art classes to youth and adults each year, including welding, encaustic, painting, drawing, photography, stained glass and more in our studios. Our Arts Education Program partners with K-12 schools and bridges a critical gap to provide immersive and quality art classes to youth who would not receive an arts education in their school without our programming.

Park City Kimball Arts Festival

Our largest event of the year is the annual Park City Kimball Arts Festival held in August, which brings over 225 jury-selected artists from around the country to Park City for approximately 55,000 attendees to enjoy. Now in its 48th year, the event brings approximately \$20 million in annual economic impact to Utah.

The 48th Annual Park City Kimball Arts Festival takes place on Historic Main Street and serves as the primary fundraiser for the Kimball Art Center. Proceeds from the Festival enable us to provide, free of charge, year-round art exhibitions, gallery tours, monthly Art Talks and to offer art education to teachers, students and our community.

Each year, we host over **50,000 guests**, **220+ jury-selected artists** from over 30 states in 12 categories, 30 live musical acts and an array of cuisine offerings. Parking

Parking remains one of the most challenging aspects of the Arts Festival. Parking operations are divided into Artist & KAC Parking and Public Parking. All parking lots are manned by PCKAF staff to ensure efficient parking and to monitor numbers. China Bridge paid parking is managed by PCMC.

Free parking lots are located at Deer Valley Resort (until 1:00 p.m.) and Park City High School. These lots will be serviced by our free shuttle buses.

In addition to servicing their regular routes, Park City Transit provides free bus service from our parking lots. We encourage locals and visitors alike to take advantage of this convenient mode of transportation. Service is available Friday evening, Saturday and Sunday from all locations. Buses will run every 15 minutes between 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.

While we encourage the use of our free lots, limited parking is also available at Park City's China Bridge Park Garage. You may enter this structure via Marsac Avenue off of Deer Valley Drive. The cost is \$10.

The Park City Kimball Arts Festival is a fully accessible event. All of our parking areas provide accessible parking. In addition, we provide a complimentary Festival golf cart shuttle to those who need assistance inside of the Festival. Please feel free to contact us with any questions at (435.649.8882).

Traffic

Park City is a small historic town with limited parking capacity. Many of the streets in Old Town will be open to residents with access passes only. These streets will be monitored by police and festival staff.

Park City Kimball Arts Festival Waste & Recycling Plan

The PCKAF utilizes two contractors and PC Municipal services and resources to maintain our waste and recycling programs. 
1.Liability Insurance Amount:


- General Liability of \$2,000,000 per occurrence/ \$4,000,000 aggregate
- **Auto Liability** of \$2,000,000 combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage per accident.

- Liquor Liability of \$1,000,000/\$2,000,000
- Proof of Workers Compensation with regard to statutory limits of \$500,000 per accident. (Please note the City does not have to be listed as additional insured on this policy specifically.)
- The Kimball Art Center shall require any hired security to provide a policy of general liability and auto liability insurance and name both the Kimball Art Center and Park City Municipal Corporation as additional insureds on the policy limits set forth above.
- The Kimball Art Center shall provide proof that they require any hired security to provide a proof of Workers Compensation insurance in the amount that is required above. (Please note the City does not have to be listed as additional insured on this policy specifically.) 2.Description of Operations/Special Items Box must Include: Park City Municipal Corporation is hereby named an additional insure with respect to liability arising out of or in connection with KAC's activities under the Service Agreement and further indemnify the City from liability occurring at the event, except for any claim arising out of the sole negligence or intentional torts of the City or its employees. It is suggested that the insurer have AM Best Financial Strength rating of at least A:VII. 3.Certificate Holder: Park City Municipal Corporation PO Box 1480 Park City, UT 84060 Please email certificates to the Park City Special Events Coordinator as follows: Jenny Diersen jenny.diersen@parkcity.org Any change of these requirements must be approved prior to approval of permit by both the Special Events Coordinator and the City Attorney's Office. Event Permits are void until Certificate of Insurance has been provided and accepted as outlined in the conditions of approval on the Special Event Permit.

 - Direct all arriving Police, Fire Department or First Responders to Events Director. Alert Events Director in all cases
 - o Following an emergency event, fill out an Incident Report
- Animal Nuisance
 - Alert EMS, Fire Department or Police on site
 - If unable to locate First Responders, call 911
 - Do not attempt to apprehend the animal
 - Alert nearby patrons of danger
- Criminal Activity
 - Alert Police on site or call 911
 - Do not intervene
- Disorderly Conduct
 - Alert Police on site or call 911
 - Do not intervene
- Electrical Storm
 - All activities will be suspended until threat levels decrease
 - Staff to prepare for evacuation. Preferred refuge at indoors location
 - Follow Evacuation procedures
- Evacuation
 - Do not initiate an evacuation without authorization from Events Director
 - o If evacuation is considered, confer with First Responders on site
 - o Stand by until staff and security personnel are in place an ready to safely execute plan
 - o Ensure the evacuation routes, refuge areas and shuttle systems are safe and prepared
 - Position staff to assist
 - Secure parking lot entrances and exits. Prevent all public traffic from entering the site unless otherwise instructed
 - O Stage shuttles, if necessary, prior to initiating evacuation
 - Calmly alert patrons of the evacuation and location or direction to evacuate to

- Staff to perform a final venue sweep to ensure it is clear and safe
- o If safe, position staff to prevent patrons from re-entering site
- Continue to monitor safety of area of refuge

Fire

- o If safe, trained staff should extinguish small fires with fire extinguishers
- If fire is determined too large to be safely extinguished, call 911
- o If safe, staff should section off affected area
- All event activities will be suspended until threat level decreases
- If necessary, follow Evacuation procedures

High Winds

- Identify potential hazards and report to Events Director
- Secure structures as needed
- Secure all potential hazards
- All event activities will be suspended until threat level decreases
- o If necessary, follow Evacuation procedures

Medical Emergency

- Call 911 in case of emergency
- o Alert EMS, Fire Department of Police on site
- o Provide support and assistance as necessary
- Do not perform rescue actions or medical procedures unless you have proper training

Power Outage

- Event to continue unless determined otherwise
- Music program requiring electricity suspended
- Food service requiring electricity suspended
- o If threat level increases, all event activities will be suspended
- If necessary, follow Evacuation procedures

Rain

- Event continues unless threat level increases
- o If threat level increases, all event activities will be suspended
- If necessary, follow Evacuation procedures


