Summary of Park City Kimball Arts Festival changes and updates, 2019.

- 1.) To celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Park City Kimball Arts Festival the event is free to all Summit County primary residents for the entire three-day event. This is possible due to the generous support of our sponsors.
- 2.) Park City Kimball Arts Festival title sponsor is Intermountain Park City Hospital. Zions Bank remains as presenting sponsor. Many additional sponsors renewed their partnerships, and new companies signed on to sponsor the Festival as well.
- 3.) The Art Starts Here Gala and Park City Kimball Arts Festival VIP Lounge are located in Kimball Terrace.
- 4.) A public exhibition celebrating the past, present and future of Kimball Art Center and the Festival will be held in the Rockwell Room (268 Main). This location will also act as a satellite artist lounge.
- 5.) Kimball Art Center will utilize a new ticketing solution, eTix. The intent is to improve the attendee experience.
- 6.) Park City Kimball Arts Festival wristbands will have RFID chips which will improve the integrity of data. In particular this will give Park City Municipal and Kimball Art Center an accurate daily count of attendees.
- 7.) Park City Kimball Arts Festival will no longer sell or provide single-use water bottles. Park City Kimball Arts Festival will sell reusable water bottles and has created four refillable water stations to provide free water to attendees.
- 8.) Food vendors are required to use compostable materials.
- 9.) All gates will be powered by solar charged generators.
- 10.) New signage will be added to Marriott / Town Lift bridge and stairs leading to Town Lift Plaza.

11.) Kimball Art Center introduces Brushes & Brunch, which will be held at Rockwell Room. This unique event allows award winning artists to mingle with prospective clients over crêpes and mimosas.

Kimball Art Center

In an incredible act of both courage and foresight, Bill Kimball opened the original Kimball Art Center in 1976, believing art would play a vital role in Park City's future. With little more than guts, determination, and creative vision, he transformed the town's garage and body shop into a community art center.

Prior to being a place for vehicles, the building was a place to park a horse. Miners would ride their horses into town and leave them at the stable while they headed into the mines on rail cars. Considering the building was located in the town's notorious red-light district and across the street from a brothel, it's safe to say the horses sometimes spent the night.

Mining was Park City's first chapter. The town's second phase, our famed skiing and recreation, has paved the way for our third mother lode — a vibrant arts and culture district that will enhance, enrich, and enlighten our community in perpetuity.

As one of Park City's oldest and most established nonprofits, Kimball Art Center has a long and proven history of providing residents, visitors, and second-homeowners with inspiration, education, and creation.

In partnership with the Park City School District, Kimball Art Center's education programs touch the lives of nearly every Park City student going through both public and private schools. Statewide, our outreach allows students K-12 to participate in immersive and high-quality art classes they would otherwise not receive in school. In addition, Kimball Art Center offers over 300 visual art classes each year, for all ages, skillsets, and interests.

To ensure our community has access to inspiring works of art, Kimball Art Center's gallery is free and open to the public. Exhibitions are distinct in both medium and range; working to showcase world-renowned artists, as well as emerging artistic talent. Kimball Art Center's curator draws on timely and relevant themes including environment, history, culture, and social challenges, to provide meaningful, thoughtful, and engaging exhibitions.

And each year Kimball Art Center hosts the Park City Kimball Arts Festival, which brings nearly 50,000 art enthusiasts to Main Street over the three-day event. Now one of the country's premier art festivals, the Park City Kimball Art Festival provides an estimated \$20 million economic boost to the state.

Profit and prominence aside, the annual Festival is one of many events Kimball Art Center presents to promote diversity, create social connection, expand creativity, and foster community pride.

Park City Kimball Arts Festival

Now in its 50th year, the Park City Kimball Arts Festival is not only one of the top ranked art festivals in the country, it's also Kimball Art Center's largest fundraiser. This three-day event allows Kimball Art Center to continue, and further, its goal to provide arts access, education, engagement and experience to everyone, all year long.

This year's Festival is presented by Intermountain Park City Hospital, and long-time partner Zions Bank. A number of additional new sponsors are also participating, allowing Kimball Art Center to "free the Fest" for Summit County locals.

More than 1,000 artist applications were received for this year's Festival — a new record! Of those applications, 225 artists were selected via a blind jury and invited to participate. Invited artists hail from 33 states and three countries.

Funds raised from the event help provide:

- Scholarships for low-income children to participate in art classes and camps
- Art education and curriculum in public schools
- After-school art programs in area elementary schools
- o Hands-on instructions for teenagers dedicated to the study and practice of the visual arts
- Cross-curriculum lesson plans integrating art into core subjects
- Access to free and thought-provoking exhibitions

2019 Art Starts Here Gala

The Art Starts Here gala is an innovative and inspiring event that highlights the importance of the arts and the critical role Kimball Art Center plays in fostering our cultural community.

Live auction items include one-of-a-kind experiences — like a chance to mingle with the New York Rangers in the locker room and attend the post-game press conference, jet off to Argentina and Uruguay and stay in some of South America's most exclusive resorts, and custom artwork by awardwinning artist Dolan Geiman.

In tandem with the Festival, the gala is a critical fundraiser for Kimball Art Center and an opportunity to celebrate creativity and community.

Parking

Parking operations are divided into artist/Kimball Art Center staff parking and public parking. All parking lots are manned by Festival staff to ensure efficient parking and to monitor numbers. China Bridge paid parking is managed by PCMC.

Free parking lots are located at Intermountain Park City Hospital, Deer Valley Resort, and Park City Mountain.

In addition to servicing their regular routes, Park City Transit provides free bus service from these dedicated parking areas. Kimball Art Center encourage locals and visitors alike to take advantage of this convenient mode of transportation, as well as promotes walking or biking to the Festival. Kimball Art Center actively discourages attendees from driving a personal vehicle and attempting to park near the Festival.

The Park City Kimball Arts Festival is a fully accessible event. All of our parking areas provide accessible parking. Park City Kimball Arts Festival Operations

The Park City Kimball Arts Festival requires a complex and well-defined plan to set-up and operate within the size restrictions of Main Street. Set up for the Arts Festival begins on Monday July 29, 2019 in off-street locations. This initial set-up should have little to no impact on Main Street.

Set begins in earnest on Wednesday July 31, 2019-up. Striking begins Sunday at 6:01 PM with Main Street open by 11:00 PM. The entire Festival is clear by 5 PM Monday, August 4th.

Festival Food and Drink

Kimball Art Center is partnering with a wide variety of food, concessions, and beverage vendors. Food trucks, spirit gardens, and refillable water stations will be strategically located throughout the Festival footprint.

Environmental Impact Reduction

Kimball Art Center will no longer sell single use water bottles. Kimball Art Center has transitioned to reusable water bottles and will provide four hydration stations. Each station has four water spouts

Kimball Art Center will also use solar reachable battery generators at all gate locations.

Park City Kimball Arts Festival Waste & Recycling Plan

The PCKAF utilizes two contractors and PC Municipal services and resources to maintain our waste and recycling programs- Recycling for the Arts Festival will focus on cardboard, metals, plastics and wood.

- Temporary Waste Bins at existing and temporary waste locations
- Temporary Recycling Bins at existing and temporary waste locations

Waste and Recycling operations will take place during all event hours. Contractors will be responsible for monitoring volumes and waste stream classifications.

Insurance Requirements for the 2019 Park City Kimball Arts Festival

Liability Insurance Amount:

- o General Liability of \$2,000,000 per occurrence/\$4,000,000 aggregate.
- Auto Liability of \$2,000,000 combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage per accident.
- Liquor Liability of \$1,000,000/\$2,000,000.
- Proof of Workers Compensation with regard to statutory limits of \$500,000 per accident. (Please note the City does not have to be listed as additional insured on this policy specifically.)
- Kimball Art Center shall require any hired security to provide a policy of general liability and auto liability insurance and name both Kimball Art Center and Park City Municipal Corporation as additional insureds on the policy limits set forth above.
- Kimball Art Center shall provide proof that it requires any hired security to provide a proof of Workers Compensation insurance in the amount that is required above. (Please note the City does not have to be listed as additional insured on this policy specifically.)

Description of Operations/Special Items Box must include:

Park City Municipal Corporation is hereby named an additional insure with respect to liability arising out of or in connection with KAC's activities under the Service Agreement and further indemnify the City from liability occurring at the event, except for any claim arising out of the sole negligence or intentional torts of the City or its employees. It is suggested that the insurer have AM Best Financial Strength rating of at least A:VII.




2019 PCKAF Site Plan










2019 PARK CITY KIMBALL ARTS FESTIVAL







The Park City Kimball Arts Festival has been committed to providing sustainable event solutions for over 10 years- In addition to our standard practice of waste recycling and diversion, the PCKAF has adopted a number of sustainable practices to reduce our overall carbon footprint including:



1. GENERAL EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

- Assess your personal safety. Assess the safety of those around you.
 - If your personal safety is threatened or you sense immediate public danger, leave the area at once. Call 911.
 - I you determine there is **no immediate danger**, alert your supervisor, KAC Staff, KAC Operations or response agency personnel nearby.
 - After alerting someone and only if the situation is safe, attempt to keep public out of the area, render assistance as necessary and take note of circumstances related to the issue.
 - **EMERGENCY**: immediate public danger call 911.
 - NON EMERGENCY: Alert supervisor, police on-site or call Summit County Dispatch 435-615-3600.
 - Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report.

2. Animal Nuisance

- Assess the situation for safety.
- Report situation immediately. Emergency or Non-Emergency
- Summit County Animal Control: 435-615-3985.
- Do not attempt to apprehend animal.
- Alert nearby guests of danger.
- Leave area if imminent threat.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

3. Auto Collision/Heavy Equipment Accident

- Assess the situation for safety.
- Report situation immediately. Emergency or Non-Emergency
- Be aware of leaking hazardous fluids, gas and oil.
- Render aid only if it is safe.
- Festival staff should cordon off area affected.
- Do not attempt to move or disturb the scene until response personnel arrive.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

4. Chemical Spill/Toxic Hazard

1

- Assess the situation for safety.
- Report situation immediately. Emergency or Non-Emergency
- If spill determined to be unsafe, call 911 and leave the area.
- Alert nearby public to avoid the area.
- Stay UP-WIND if possible.
- Be aware of hazardous materials, fluids, gases, oils, smoke, fire, chemical reactions or unconscious victims. Call 911 and leave the area immediately if detected.
- Look for HAZMAT placards. Leave the area immediately if detected.
- Render aid only if it is safe. Unconscious victims should not be attended to without proper personal protection equipment.
- Do not attempt to move or disturb the scene until response personnel arrive.
- Do not attempt to determine HAZMAT spill by touch, taste or smell.
- If safe, Operations will use Chemical Spill Kit to clean up spill.
- Festival staff will cordon off area affected.
- If determined to be hazardous materials beyond routine clean-up, call 911.
- All festival activities in affected area will be suspended until clean-up is complete.
- Emergency situations will require closure of a much larger area up to and including closure of the Festival per direction by the Incident Commander.
- Do not initiate an evacuation unless directed by the Incident Commander or the situation requires immediate action due to imminent threat or death.
- If directed and safe, alert Artists and guests of threat.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

5. Civil Disturbance/Protest

- Assess the situation for safety.
- Report Issue immediately. Emergency or Non-Emergency
- Do not engage or discuss with persons involved with issue. Do not attempt to stop or impede the disturbance.
- If necessary, festival activities will be suspended until threat level decreases.
- If directed, alert Artists of closure.
- Move out suspended until threat level decreases-
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

6. Criminal Activity

- Assess the situation for safety.
- Report Issue immediately. Emergency or Non-Emergency
- Alert Park City Police Department, PCKAF Operations or PCKAF Security on-site.
- Do not intervene.
- Theft: Report to Supervisor and PCKAF Operations immediately.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

7. Disorderly Conduct

- Assess the situation for safety.
- Report Issue immediately. Emergency or Non-Emergency.
- Do not attempt to apprehend, stop or otherwise engage the disorderly person(s).
- Do not ask disorderly person to leave PCKAF Operations or police will assume that responsibility as necessary.
- If safe, alert nearby artists and public to be aware of the disorderly behavior. Do this quietly and professionally. Try not to attract the attention of the disorderly person as this may aggravate them further.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

8. Earthquake

- Take cover as quickly as possible.
- Be aware of surrounding dangers including building collapse, falling debris, gas leaks, powerlines and electrical dangers, water leaks/flooding, broken glass, ground subsidence, fissures and liquefaction as well as moving vehicles.
- Assess the situation for safety.
- Report serious emergencies immediately to 911 (note, circuits may be overloaded or unavailable).
- All festival activities in affected area will be suspended until further notice.
- Render assistance to victims only if safe.
- Emergency situations may require closure of the Festival per direction of the Incident Commander.
- Stay clear of the Incident Command Post unless requested.
- **Do not initiate an evacuation** unless directed by the Incident Commander or the situation requires immediate action due to imminent threat or death.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.
- All festival activities will be suspended until threat level decreases.
- If directed and safe, alert Artists and guests of threat.
- Move out suspended until threat level decreases.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

9. Lightning/Electrical Storm

- Take cover as quickly as possible.
- Assess the situation for safety.
- Immediately Report serious emergencies to 911.
- All festival activities in affected area will be suspended until further notice.
- Render assistance to victims only if safe.
- Emergency situations may require closure of the Festival per direction of the Incident Commander.
- **Do not initiate an evacuation** unless directed by the Incident Commander or the situation requires immediate action due to imminent threat or death.

- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.
- If directed and safe, alert Artists and guests of threat.
- Move out suspended until threat level decreases.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

10. Evacuation

Do not initiate an evacuation unless directed by the Incident Commander or PCKAF Operations Director.

- **Do not initiate an evacuation** unless directed by the Incident Commander or the situation requires immediate action due to imminent threat or death.
- If an evacuation is necessary, please standby for instructions and Police, Fire, Operations and Security staff are in place and ready to safely execute the evacuation.
- Provide assistance for evacuation as directed. Participation is voluntary.
- Ensure the evacuation route and the intended area of refuge are safe.
- Position staff to assist patrons with evacuation.
- Calmly alert patrons and artists of need to evacuate.
- Ensure area is clear before evacuating staff.
- If safe, position staff to prevent patrons from re-entering evacuated area.
- Assist public as necessary.
- Continue to monitor safety of Area of Refuge. Alert emergency response personnel of additional threats and dangers.
- Avoid mixing vehicle traffic and pedestrians is possible.
- All activities are suspended until threat level decreases.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

11. Fire

- Assess the situation for safety.
- Immediately Report serious emergencies to 911.
- Do not attempt to extinguish the fire unless you are trained to do so.
- Do not attempt a structure rescue unless you are trained and equipped to do so.
- Be aware of incoming response vehicles including vehicles entering the Festival use areas. Alert public of these vehicles. Clear space as necessary.
- Festival staff & security to provide assistance to public.
- If safe, Festival staff should cordon off area affected.
- All festival activities will be suspended until threat level decreases.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

12. Flood:

• Assess the situation for safety.

- Immediately Report serious emergencies to 911.
- If heavy rain, always assume the possibility of a flash-flood.
- If directed, alert artists of impending danger.
- Do not attempt to cross or divert fast moving water regardless of depth. Be aware of debris and other hazards.
- Do not attempt a water rescue unless you are trained and equipped to do so.
- Be aware of incoming response vehicles including vehicles entering the Festival use areas. Alert public of these vehicles. Clear space as necessary.
- Festival staff & security to provide assistance to public.
- If safe, Festival staff should cordon off area affected.
- Do not move artist booths or product to locations that will impede public exiting.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

13. High Winds:

- Assess the situation for safety.
- Immediately Report serious emergencies to 911.
- If directed, alert artists of impending danger. Artists should secure booths if directed.
- Be aware of flying debris and other hazards such as trees, powerlines and other dangerous issues.
- Festival staff & security to provide assistance to public as needed.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

14. Medical Emergency

- Assess the situation for safety.
- Immediately report serious emergencies to 911.
- Perform life-saving techniques if necessary.
- Look for medical alerting devices or other indicators of a medical issue.
- Provide clearance for the victim and access for EMT/Medical personnel.
- Provide assistance as requested.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

15. Power Outage

- Assess the situation for safety.
- Immediately report serious emergencies to 911 (downed powerlines, etc.)
- Alert your Supervisor or PCKAF Operations.
- General outage: event continues. No artist booths effected.
- Emergency situation related outage: Refer to incident instructions.
- Music program suspended until further notice.
- Food service requiring electricity suspended until further notice.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

16. Rain/Downpour:

- Assess the situation for safety.
- Immediately Report serious emergencies to 911.
- The Festival will continue rain or shine unless the situation dictates other emergency response actions.
- If directed, alert artists of impending danger. Artists should secure booths if directed.
- Be aware of flash-floods, debris and other hazards such as trees, powerlines and highwinds
- Festival staff & security to provide assistance to public as needed.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.

17. Structural Collapse

- Do not enter a collapsed structure.
- Assess the situation for safety.
- Report serious emergencies immediately to 911 (note, circuits may be overloaded or unavailable).
- Be aware of surrounding dangers including further building collapse, falling debris, gas leaks, downed powerlines and electrical dangers, water leaks/flooding, broken glass and other collapse related dangers.
- Do not attempt a collapse rescue unless you are trained and equipped to do so.
- Do not remove collapse-debris unless directed by the Incident Commander.
- All festival activities in affected area will be suspended until further notice.
- Emergency situations may require closure of the Festival per direction of the Incident Commander.
- **Do not initiate an evacuation** unless directed by the Incident Commander or the situation requires immediate action due to imminent threat or death.
- All festival activities will be suspended until threat level decreases.
- If directed and safe, alert Artists and guests of threat.
- Take note of the situation, time and circumstances. Fill out a PCKAF Incident Report after the situation is neutralized.
