
% Personnel Decomposition by Total \$ Cost - FY21


YoY Change in Key Incremental Cost Drivers - FY20 vs. FY21




YTD Personnel Expenses vs. FY21 Budget by Type



Additional YTD Expenses vs. FY21 Budget by Type





Project Manager 1 Resource Decomposition Over Time






Project Management Volume

Sustainability - Capital Project Management by Size Over Time









 Per the City's existing plan regarding Treasure Hill & Armstrong, staff recommends updating the project budgets to account for the increased funding from the City's recent 2020 GO Bond issuance



Open Space Acquisition & Improvements Treasure Hill & Armstrong

Funding is intended for:

Trailhead Infrastructure (Treasure Hill & Armstrong) - Current Estimates of the new trailhead and associated infrastructure are approximately \$40k. Maintenance efforts, including trash removal and mutt mitt stations will be absorbed into current operations.

6th Street Stairs - 6th Street Stair connections to the Treasure Hill open space are proposed and planned under previous guidance from Council

Additional Improvement Items (Treasure Hill & Armstrong) - Amounts associated with this item are intended for forest health, wildfire defense, tree management, etc.






Trailheads – Bonanza Flat



Bonanza Flat Trailhead - Daily Avg. Parking Use vs. Max




Trailheads – Empire Pass



Empire Pass Trailhead - Daily Avg. Parking Use vs. Max







Blood's Lake Usage Volume per Day - Summer 2020




