

What the Heck is Emergency Management? (and why do I care?)



2003 – POTUS issues HSPD-5, requiring NIMS for Federal agencies, recommending for states, local governments


2006/7 - EM program initiated





YoY Change in Key Incremental Cost Drivers - FY20 vs. FY21*






YTD Personnel Expenses vs. FY21 Budget by Type

Budget Summary Decomposition by Expense Type - FY21







Emergency Operations Center



- Supports incident commander, multiagency coordination group, joint information center
- Organized along departmental lines, designated staff → ideally 3 deep to support 24/7 operations
- Rapidly deployable to main or alternate sites 'EOC on wheels'
- Situational awareness/resource support
- Coordination of operations
- Planning
- Communications

Supports incident command at or near the scene with:

- Comms (800MHz, VHF, Ham, Cradlepoint, WiFi)
- Shelter
- Staff support
- Briefing support
- Equipment deployment
- 'EOC on Wheels'



- Similar to Amber Alert capability
- EAS-capable
- Tested monthly
- Will soon also be able to broadcast to NOAA weather radios
- Real-world use during 2021 Parley's Canyon Fire, 2020 Magna EQ, armed suspects, HAZMAT and wildfire evacuations in County
- Spanish-language capability



Emergency Mass Notification System System




- Alerts sent in last 30 days (15 original + followups)

EMNS Web Registrations since COVID-19














- Used in incident reconstruction, public safety response


Access Control




