NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY

1108 Park is a central block type house that has undergone several material alterations. The central block, while not one of the main three house types built during the historic Park City mining era, was still common in that time

period. The gable roof is sheathed with composition shingles and a brick chimney is located near the peak on the middle of the roof. Aluminum siding clads the walls, which replaced the drop-novelty wood shown in the c. 1940 tax photo. The porch is inset on the south corner with a square post supporting the roof at the corner. The windows all appear to be aluminum, replacing the wood framed windows shown in the c. 1940. There is a large fixed pane window on the frontmost part of the house and a large slider in the porch area, both flanked with decorative shutters. The door is a simple wood door with ascending lights. A small gabled garage is present at the rear of the lot but there are no historical references to it, making it impossible to know when it was built. The concrete foundation is visible where the site slopes downward. The material changes have diminished the historic value of the house.

Narrative Statement of Significance:

This house was built between 1900 and 1907, based off the Sanborn Insurance maps from those years. The house was expanded sometime between 1929 and 1941, as the house on the 1941 Sanborn map appears to have been widened. The first individual to own the property when the house existed was likely Robert T. Kimball.

Robert Kimball appears on the 1910 census, living in a house on Woodside Avenue with his wife Amanda and their five children. He was born in Salt Lake City in 1856, and owned a livery stable. He was very active in the social and fraternal organizations. He died in 1934, but the property stayed in his family. This house only appears on the 1940 census, indicating that it was unoccupied during both the 1920 and 1930 censuses. During 1940 the house was occupied by Robert T. Kimball's son, Robert W. Kimball.

Robert W. Kimball lived in the house with his wife Elizabeth and their three children. He worked on the school board, but nothing else is known of him or his family. He sold the house in 1945 to George Henry Skillicorn. The house stayed in the Skillicorn family until 1978, when it was sold to Brian and Claudia Myres, the current owners.






1108 Park Avenue. West elevation. November 2013.


