NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY

115 Sampson is a pyramid type house that has undergone several material alterations. The pyramid house is one of the main three house types built during the historic Park City mining era. Several additions are present, but due to the location of the house are difficult to verify. The roof is sheathed with a standing seam metal and has several dormers protruding through it. The walls are clad with aluminum siding, and a section the porch area is clad with stone veneer. Though historic information regarding this house is sparse, it is certain that these materials are not original. The windows have also been replaced, with most of them being aluminum sliders. There is a large single pane window flanked by narrow panes on either side of the centered door. A sliding window sits in the dormer on the primary façade. The porch is covered by a shed extension of the main roof and is supported by square wood posts topped with decorative brackets. The porch is made of wood and raised slightly off the ground. The house is well below the grade of the road. The cumulative formal and material changes have diminished its historic value.

Narrative Statement of Significance:

(Briefly describe those characteristics by which this property may be considered historically significant.)

This house appears on the 1907 Sanborn Insurance map, which was the first map to cover this area. It was initially owned by the Park City Townsite Corporation, and may have been used to house workers. The title history shows that the house was not purchased by an individual until 1937, with the earliest mention elsewhere of the property being on the 1940 census. The house may have been included in other censuses, but due to its location in the middle of the block, was either not addressed appropriately or included in another area.

Frank Pintar purchased the house in 1937, and appears on the 1940 census, living there with his wife Celia, and their son Victor. The census also states that they lived in and presumably owned the house in 1935, indicating that there may be an error in the title history. The census shows that Frank and Celia were from Austria, but a death notice for Celia Pintar shows that she was born in Yugoslavia. Both Frank and his son worked as miners. They sold the house in 1942 and it is currently owned by Silver Potato LLC.







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





115 Sampson Avenue. Northwest oblique. November 2013.

Mrs. Cecilia Pintar, 71. widow of Frank Pintar, died Sunday 9 s.m., after long illness, at residence in Heber, where she had resided three months. Born Nov. 13, 1881, Yugoslavia, came to U. S. 1903, residing in Park City about 30 years. Mr. Pintar died four years ago. Survivors, a daughter, Mrs. Mary Himes, Salt Lake City; a son. Victor J. Pintar, Heber; nine grandchildren; five sisters and a brother.
