## NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY

The garage at 135 Sampson Avenue is a simple, wood-frame shed-roof structure. The only opening is the hinged double-door on the south façade. The garage is indicative of vernacular Park City outbuildings which were typically not constructed by skilled craftsman, but rather untrained property owners. Further, the metal cladding and dimensional lumbuer used in its construction would have been readily available in a mining town. The doors are typical of those seen in Park City throughout the Mature Mining Era (1894-1930).

Narrative Statement of Significance:

The garage structure constructed at 135 Sampson Avenue was initially constructed ca. 1900; however, it first appears in the 1907 Sanborn Fire Insurance map. Prior to this time, the structure was located outside of the Sanborn Fire Insurance map boundary. According to these maps, the structure was associated with a historic house at 79 Utah Avenue and was a one-story woodframe stable. A c.1904 photograph also shows that the structure has a shed roof, facing downhill and sloping away from the road.

By 1929, the house at 79 Utah Avenue had been lost and a portion of the shed structure had been demolished to create a smaller square shape. This is the shape that exists today.





135 Sampson Avenue. West Elevation. November 2014.





135 Sampson Avenue. Southwest oblique. Camera facing northeast. November 2014.





