

Residential Parking

Due to the historic nature of Old Town streets, street parking in residential areas is very limited.


- Residential streets south (uphill) of 12th Street and west of Main Street require a Residential Parking Permit for on-street parking. This excludes Park Avenue from 12th Street to Heber Avenue as parking is allowed there without a permit.
- Please respect this limited parking resource and only park on these streets if you have a Resident Parking Permit or related guest permit.

YOUR GUIDE TO GETTING AROUND HISTORIC PARK CITY & MAIN STREET



LEAVE THE DRIVING TO US

Park City is a unique place to visit because you don't need a car to get around town. Visitors can enjoy our FREE transit system that enables easy travel in town, at Kimball's Junction and the Factory Stores, and to all three ski resorts, without parking hassles.

The **PC-SLC Connect** provides daily bus service to and from Salt Lake City during peak commute times. Private transportation services offer shuttle and limo services to and from the Salt Lake International Airport, further eliminating your need to rent a car.



Schedules & Routes

The best way to access information regarding transit schedules and routes is to visit www.parkcitytransit.org. You can also call (435) 615-5350 for a recorded message explaining transit services.

Bus Stops

For your safety, buses pick up and drop off at designated bus stops only. Please arrive two to three minutes early and be sure to check the overhead destination sign to ensure you are boarding the right bus. If you have any questions regarding transit times and destinations once you are on the bus, feel free to ask our friendly bus drivers who are always willing to help.

Easy-to-find bus stop signs are bright blue with white lettering.



MAIN STREET TROLLEY

In addition to our regular transit service, Park City also offers the Main Street Trolley, a unique and convenient way to get up and down Main Street. You can catch the Trolley from 10 a.m.-11 p.m. daily at the designated stops along Main Street, or simply wave to the Trolley driver to indicate that you would like to ride.

The Trolley also serves as a connection between Main Street and the Old Town Transit Center where connections can be made to all other routes in the system.

MAIN STREET PARKING

If you choose to drive your own vehicle into Old Town, here are a few smart options:

Free Parking

- 75% of public parking in Historic Park City is FREE.
- Swede Alley lots, covered levels of China Bridge and the upper level of Gateway garage are the closest free parking areas to Main Street (4-hour limits).
- Free daily parking is available on all uncovered levels of the China Bridge Garage until 3:00 a.m. (no parking from 3 a.m.-7a.m.).
- Free parking is available in the Sandridge and North Marsac lots adjacent to Marsac Avenue with 24-hour limits and overnight restrictions (see entrance signs).
- Please note that parking in these lots will be restricted during the Sundance Film Festival and Arts Festival.



Paid Parking

The most convenient parking spots are along Main Street and in the Wasatch Brew Pub lot at the top of Main Street.

- Paid parking spaces are \$1.50 per hour, 3-hour time limit.
- Paid parking is enforced from 11 a.m.-8 p.m. daily (no parking from 2 a.m.-6 a.m.)

Pay & Display Parking

The Pay & Display system is utilized on Main Street and in the Wasatch Brew Pub lot and is simple to use in 3 easy steps:



1. Find a legal parking space to park your vehicle.
2. Locate one of the pay stations identified by our "P" icon and the words "Pay To Park" and insert coins or credit cards.
3. Once you obtain a receipt from the pay station, display the receipt on your dashboard and be sure that it is visible from the outside.

Special Needs Parking

Mobility-disabled persons with a state-approved license plate or permit can park in any paid parking spot at no charge. Certain exceptions may apply during the Sundance Film Festival and Park City Arts Festival. Please contact Parking Services at 435-615-5301 for more details.
